Mid green semi translucent foliage integrates well with other members of this genus such as Pittosporum ralphii, Pittosporum eugenoides (Lemmonwood) and Pittosporum crassifolium.

Grows well throughout Banks Peninsula and in hill suburbs needs space, more suited to corner plantings or garden borders at least one and a half metres wide, but not very frost tolerant on the plains so needs protection by way of companion planting with more hardy species.

A native of Banks Peninsula, and only moderately frost tolerant it needs some added protection by way of companion planting with other trees such as Whiteywood or closeness to buildings or established trees on the plains.

This is a really useful plant for creating a dramatic effect close up and in spite of its tropical look is quite frost hardy.

Loses leaves in winter so can be planted in protected position close in to houses and amongst other foliage such as tree ferns or pittosporums for the bushland effect.

It is very frost tender and growth is restricted to Banks Peninsula and beachside suburbs around Sumner where it does well tucked into depressions and on the hill slopes as far as Cashmere.
